You have renewed us with the living bread from heaven by it you nourish our faith, increase our hope, and strengthen our love: teach us always to hunger for him who is the true and living bread, and enable us to live by every word that proceeds from out of your mouth; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

¶ Please sit or kneel for **The Intercessory Prayers**

As children of a loving God who always listens to our cries, let us pray to our Father in heaven.

*To the bidding '*God of Love' *Please respond by saying 'hear our prayer.'*

At the end of the prayers the priest introduces a period for silent reflection after which we say the concluding prayer

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. (Luke 1:28)Blessed art thou among women,and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. (Luke 1:42).Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners,now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Theological note: The phrase 'Mother of God' in the above can raise the proverbial eyebrow and cause difficulty for some. Please note, however, that it should not be taken literally. It arises out of a decree of the Council of Ephesus in the year 431, which refers to Mary, in Greek, as 'Theotokos', meaning 'God-bearer'. In the process of translation this became corrupted to Mother of God and as such has gained common usage in the Western Church.




