*Theological note: The phrase 'Mother of God' in the above can raise the proverbial  
eyebrow and cause difficulty for some. Please note, however, that it should not be  
taken literally. It arises out of a decree of the Council of Ephesus in the year 431, which  
refers to Mary, in Greek, as 'Theotokos', meaning 'God-bearer'. In the process of  
translation this became corrupted to Mother of God and as such has gained common  
usage in the Western Church.*


On the night before he died he had supper with his friends
