One of the biggest problems we have is in making up balanced nutritional packages that enable all who need our help to be treated equally. The other major problem is storage. Each different item needs a separate shelf allocation and sadly many larger sized packages are of little use to us as we are only supply enough food to last three days in each package. (5kg of pasta is a challenge for any family let alone a single person ,to eat in this time if they are to have a varied diet!) Likewise tins of exotic items are not helpful neither is fresh produce as those we are needing our help, as many only have basic cooking facilities .

So what so we want? We always have a need for the items as listed on the website (see above) but our real needs at present are for: Large packets of Cream Crackers 500g bags of granulated sugar or pasta. small jars of coffee, tins of ready made custard or rice pudding and cartons of semi skimmed long life milk, Finally, long life apple or orange fruit juice. 1 litre size please) It is of the greatest benefit to our users if you could donate only these items

One of the major problems the church experiences in the present time is that few people carry cash on them as has been the way in the past. This has a big impact on our collections which are a very important source of our income.
