Lent Courses

During Lent we are offering you the chance to join in a course entitled *Praise Him*. This has been written by Paula Gooder, a much respected theologian who was Fr Mark's Tutor at college. It also features contributions from David Suchet, CBE, The Rt Revd Justin Welby and Sr Wendy. This course will run on Mondays at 11.00 in Church, followed by a soup lunch and discussion; it will be repeated at 19.30 for those at work during the day. The five sessions are: 23 Feb *Gratitude* (Ephesians 1: 3—14); 2 Mar *Image of God* (Colossians 1: 15—20); 9 Mar *Humility* (Philippians 2: 5—11); 16 Mar *New birth* (1 Peter 1: 3—12); and finally on 23 Mar *Word made flesh* (John 1: 1—14). We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

It is customary to bow your head for the next three lines

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.
