STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In a wonderful moment in one of Terry Pratchett's *Discworld* novels, Death (an anthropomorphic personification) muses on the virtues of camomile. He has just discovered that it can be made into both soap and a tea; 'clean both inside and out,' he reflects. 'You are witnesses of these things,' Jesus told his disciples. Meditating on this theme of witnessing, the author of our Epistle concludes that it is the vocation of the Christian to be a witness and celebrant of the greatness of the love of God. 'What we will be has not yet been made known,' he says, 'But we know that when he appears we shall be like him.' Our transformation will be complete: inside and out.

There is currently something of a vogue for 'makeover' programmes – houses, cars, and even people's appearances. But no matter what is done superficially, the essential structure remains the same. Sometimes, this is a matter of chance – architects recently discovered that a thirteenth century shop in Berkhampstead only remained standing because the adjoining properties held it up after an enthusiastic, but misguided, Victorian developer cut through the main timbers of the cruck frame to install a staircase! The 'makeover' of the Holy Spirit is rather more thorough – but without damaging the essential integrity of our personality. One expression of this is the extent to which our lives show the loving generosity that lies at the heart of God himself.

At the conclusion of the Gospel the reader says This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

¶ Please sit for the **Sermon**

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

It is customary to bow your head for the next three lines:

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen. Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption. As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of The blessed Virgin Mary, The Apostles, The Martyrs and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

¶ Please stand for The Peace

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia The peace of the Lord be always with you **and also with you.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace. All may exchange a sign of peace.

¶ Remain standing for the Offertory Hymn

During which the gifts of the people are gathered and presented and a collection is taken for the Mission (Work) of the Church.

In Christ alone my hope is found, He is my light, my strength, my song; This Cornerstone, this solid Ground, Firm through the fiercest drought and storm. What heights of love, what depths of peace, When fears are stilled, when strivings cease! My Comforter, my All in All, Here in the love of Christ I stand.

In Christ alone! - who took on flesh, Fullness of God in helpless babe. This gift of love and righteousness, Scorned by the ones He came to save: Till on that cross as Jesus died, The wrath of God was satisfied -For every sin on Him was laid; Here in the death of Christ I live. There in the ground His body lay, Light of the world by darkness slain: Then bursting forth in glorious day Up from the grave He rose again!
