A note from the Treasurer

I would like to thank you all for your continued financial support during the year using the Envelope Scheme and Planned Giving direct into our Bank Account. This helps us to budget how much money we have to cover our expenses each month including Parish Share, gas, electricity and water, minor repairs and servicing costs to the church. Ideally we need £1500 each week as £1000 is required to cover the Parish Share which is £52,661 for the year.

Unfortunately as we approach the end of the year I have calculated that there will be a shortfall of £5000 in the amount needed to pay the Parish Share. I am therefore having to make an appeal for a loan or loans from several congregation members to help out. By paying the full amount we then qualify for a rebate from the Diocese which I can then use towards repayment of gracious loans.
