The priest addresses the parents:

What name have you given your child?

Parents: Aidan Samuel.

What do you ask of God's Church for Aidan Samuel?

Parents: Baptism.

You have asked to have your child baptised. In doing so you are accepting the responsibility of training him in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbour. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?

Parents: We do.

The priest addresses the godparents:

Are you ready to help the parents of this child in their duty as Christian parents?

Godparents: We are.

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for this child who has come to be baptised today. Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church. So I ask you all:

Will you support this child as he begins his journey of faith?

All: We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family?

All: We will.

Aidan Samuel, the Christian community welcomes you with great joy. In its name I claim you for Christ our Saviour by the sign of his cross. I now trace the cross on your forehead and I invite your parents and godparents to do the same.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

¶ Remain standing for the **Blessing**

The Lord be with you and also with you.



Setting Mass for All Saints: Martin Everett






¶ Remain standing for the **Collect**

Distribution of the Sacrament

Anyone who has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and wishes to receive the love of the Lord Jesus in their life, is welcome to receive communion at this service. Alternatively you may wish to come for a blessing: please keep your hands down and your head bowed to indicate that this is your preference.

¶ Please join in singing the **Communion Hymn**

Strengthen for service, Lord, the hands
That holy things have taken;
Let ears that now have heard thy songs
To clamour never waken.

Lord, may the tongues which 'Holy' sang Keep free from all deceiving; The eyes which saw thy love be bright, Thy blessed hope perceiving.

Behold the Lamb of God.

Behold Him who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

¶ Please sit or kneel for the Lamb of God

While the Altar Party receives the Sacrament, the choir leads the singing of the 'Agnus Dei' (Lamb of God). Please join in singing:

¶ The Liturgy of the Word

¶ Please sit for the **First Reading** (Hosea 11: 1–11)

At the end the reader says:

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

¶ Remain seated for the **Responsorial Psalm** (Ps. 95)

and join in singing the Response

Response and Chant: MHE



Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us.

Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. (Response)

Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us, for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand. (Response)

O that to-day you would listen to his voice!
'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah,
as on that day at Massah in the desert

At the end of the Gospel the reader says:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.


The priest address the candidate through the parents and godparents:

Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.


In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask:



Please remain standing as the Priest recalls the Last Supper. He then sings:

Great is the mystery of faith.



The Prayer continues, concluding with the words:

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours,

O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the **Prayer Over the Gifts**

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.

Merciful Lord, make holy these gifts, And let our spiritual sacrifice make us an everlasting gift to you Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the **Eucharistic Prayer (E)**



The Priest praises God for his mighty acts in words ending:

... with saints and angels praising you and singing:

Do you turn away from sin?

Do you reject evil?

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord?

I do.

We anoint you with the oil of salvation in the name of Christ our Saviour: may he strengthen you with his power, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the candidate's forehead using the Oil of Catechumens.

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

¶ Please stand for the **Procession to the Font** and join in singing:

All creatures of our God and King,
Lift up your voice and with us sing
Alleluia, alleluia!
Thou burning sun with golden beam,
Thou silver moon with softer gleam:
O praise him, O praise him,
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Thou flowing water, pure and clear,
Make music for thy Lord to hear,
Alleluia, alleluia!
Thou fire so masterful and bright,
That givest man both warmth and light:
O praise him, O praise him,

¶ Remain standing for the **Prayer over the Water**

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptised in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love.

He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him.

Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, † that those who are baptised in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever.

Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the **Declaration of Faith**

The priest addresses the parents and godparents:

You have come here to present this child for baptism. By water and the Holy Spirit he is to receive the gift of new life from God, who is love. On your part, you must make it your constant care to bring him up in the practice of the faith. See that the divine life which God gives him is kept safe from the poison of sin, to grow always stronger in his heart. If your faith makes you ready to accept this responsibility, renew now the vows of your own baptism.

Reject sin; profess your faith in Christ Jesus.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is the faith in which this child is about to be baptised.

Priest: Do you believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth?

All: I do.

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died,

and was buried, rose from the dead,

and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

All: I do.

A collection is taken for the mission and upkeep of the Church.

The gifts of the people are gathered and presented.

The table is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it.

Priest: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

All: I do.

Priest: This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church.

We are proud to profess it, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

All: Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the **Baptism**

The priest asks the parents and godparents

Is it your will that Aidan should be baptised in the faith of the Church, which we have all professed with you? Parents and Godparents: It is.

The priest pours water on the candidate three times, saying:

Aidan, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the **Anointing with Chrism**

God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people.

He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation.

As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.

Amen.

Oil of Chrism is poured on the head of the candidate.

¶ Remain standing for the Clothing with a White Garment

Aidan, you have become a new creation, and have clothed yourself in Christ. See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven. **Amen.**

¶ Remain standing for the **Welcome**

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body. We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

The congregation greets the newly baptised.

¶ Please remain standing for the **Prayers of Penitence**

God our Father, long-suffering, full of grace and truth, you create us from nothing and give us life. You give your faithful people new life in the water of baptism.

You do not turn your face from us, nor cast us aside. We confess that we have sinned against you and our neighbour.

We have wounded your love and marred your image in us. Restore us for the sake of your Son, and bring us to heavenly joy, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Almighty God,
who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you,
† pardon and deliver you from all your sins,
confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,
and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
