keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities;

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

# ¶ The Liturgy of the Word

¶ Please sit for the First Reading (Proverbs 8: 1–4, 22–31)

At the end the reader says: This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

¶ Remain seated for the **Responsorial Psalm** (Ps. 8)

and join in singing the Response

Response and Chant: MHE



When I see the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and stars which you arranged, what is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him? (*Response*)

Yet you have made him little less than a god; with glory and honour you crowned him, gave him power over the works of your hands, put all things under his feet. *(Response)* 

All of them, sheep and cattle, yes, even the savage beasts, birds of the air, and fish that make their way through the waters. *(Response)* 

¶ Remain seated for the **Second Reading** (Romans 5: 1–5)

At the end the reader says: This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.** 

#### ¶ Please stand for the Gospel Acclamation

and turn towards the Gospel reader



Cantor: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, the God who is, who was, and who is to be.

All: Alleluia (as above)

¶ Remain standing for the **Gospel** (John 16: 12–15)

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the Gospel the reader says: We give thanks to God for the good news of Christ and sing in praise

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, m maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

Please bow for the next three lines:

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## ¶ Please sit or kneel for the **Prayers of Intercession**

Let us pray to the Father by the power of the Holy Spirit and through our Lord Jesus Christ.

To the bidding Mercy and grace please respond by saying we plead before your throne in heaven.

At the end of the intercessions the priest says a concluding prayer which ends:

... as we worship you, saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory: hosanna in the highest.

#### ¶ Remain standing for the Offertory Hymn

The Altar is prepared and gifts of bread and wine are placed on it.

I bind unto myself today The strong name of the Trinity By invocation of the same, The Three in One and One in Three. I bind this day to me for ever, By power of faith, Christ's incarnation, His baptism in the Jordan river, His death on Cross for my salvation, His bursting from the spiced tomb, His riding up the heavenly way, His coming at the day of doom, I bind unto myself today. I bind unto myself today The virtues of the starlit heaven, The glorious sun's life-giving ray, The whiteness of the moon at even. The flashing of the lightning free, The whirling wind's tempestuous shocks, The stable earth, the deep salt sea Around the old eternal rocks. I bind unto myself today The power of God to hold and lead, His eye to watch, his might to stay, His ear to hearken to my need, The wisdom of my God to teach, His hand to guide, his shield to ward; The word of God to give me speech, His heavenly host to be my guard.

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## ¶ Remain standing for the **Prayer Over the Gifts**

Pray, my brothers and sisters that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

#### May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.

Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, give us the bread of everlasting life, and make us branches of the true vine. **Amen.** 



¶ Remain standing throughout the Eucharistic Prayer (E)



It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For with your only-begotten Son and the Holy Spirit you are one God, one Lord. All that you reveal of your glory, the same we believe of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, without any difference or inequality.

We, your holy Church, acclaim you, Father of majesty unbounded, your true and only Son, worthy of all worship, and the Holy Spirit, advocate and guide. Three Persons we adore, one in being and equal in majesty.

And so with angels and archangels, with cherubim and seraphim, we sing for ever of your glory:



We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:



Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with [*N and*] all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.



#### ¶ Remain standing for the Lord's Prayer

Jesus taught us to call God our Father, and so we have the courage to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### ¶ Remain standing for the Breaking of the Bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

#### ¶ Remain standing for the Invitation to Communion

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

#### Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

# **Distribution of the Sacrament**

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us. Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

Anyone who has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and wishes to receive the love of the Lord Jesus in their life, is welcome to receive communion at this service. The Chalice will be offered for those who wish to receive in both kinds. There is no compulsion about this. If you are worried about receiving the Chalice, please remember that making your Communion in one kind is entirely acceptable.

#### The Eucharist and Intinction

Intinction is the practice of dipping the bread wafers into the wine. This has implications for those who are gluten intolerant as traces of gluten are more likely to enter the wine. We therefore ask you **not to dip the wafer into the chalice**.

Alternatively you may wish to come for a blessing: please keep your hands down and your head bowed to indicate that this is your preference.

¶ Please join in singing the **Communion Hymn**
