

Isaiah 63: 7-9 and Hebrews 2: 10-18

At the end of each the reader says:

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

¶ Stand for the Profession of Faith

(from the Athanasian Creed)

God, of the being of the Father, the only Son from before time began; human from the being of his mother, born in the world; fully God and fully human; human in both mind and body.

As God he is equal to the Father, as human he is less than the Father. Although he is both divine and human he is not two beings but one Christ.

One, not by turning God into flesh, but by taking humanity into God; truly one, not by mixing humanity with Godhead, but by being one person.

For as mind and body form one human being so the one Christ is both divine and human.

The Word became flesh and lived among us; we have seen his glory, the glory of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Christ, before whom the wise men knelt, give humility and wisdom to all who govern. Jesus, Saviour,

hear our prayer.

Christ, whose radiance filled a lowly manger, give the glory of your resurrection to all who rest in you. Jesus, Saviour,

hear our prayer.

Jesus, Saviour, child of Mary, you know us and love us. You share our lives and hear our prayer. Glory to you for ever. Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the **Peace**

Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will, who live and reign for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And also with you.

Let us offer one other a sign of peace.

All may offer one another the customary sign of peace: a handclasp or handshake, which is an expression of peace, communion and love.

¶ Remain standing for the **Offertory Hymn**

A collection is taken for the mission and upkeep of the Church. The Altar is prepared and gifts of bread and wine are placed on it.

¶ Remain standing for the **Prayer over the Gifts**


Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty father.

¶ Remain standing throughout the Eucharistic Prayer (E)






All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere, mighty creator, everliving God.


We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, who for love of our fallen race humbled himself, was born of the Virgin Mary by the power of your Spirit, and lived as one of us.

In this mystery of the Word made flesh you have caused his light to shine in our hearts, to give knowledge of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ.

In him we see our God made visible and so are caught up in the love of the God we cannot see.

Therefore with all the angels of heaven we lift our voices to proclaim the glory of your name and sing our joyful hymn of praise:






We praise and bless you, loving father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.


So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:



Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the Earth. Look with favour

on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.





¶ Remain standing for the Lord's Prayer

Jesus taught us to call God our Father, and so we say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

¶ Remain standing for the Breaking of the Bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.


Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

¶ Remain standing for the Invitation to Communion

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

¶ Kneel or sit for the Lamb of God



Distribution of the Sacrament

Anyone who has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and wishes to receive the love of the Lord Jesus in their life,

is welcome to receive communion at this service.

The Chalice is there for those who wish to receive it.

There is no compulsion about this. If you are worried about receiving the Chalice, please remember that making your Communion in one kind is entirely valid.

We ask you not to dip the wafer into the chalice.

Alternatively you may wish to come for a blessing: please keep your hands down and your head bowed to indicate that this is your preference.

¶ Remain kneeling or seated for the **Communion Hymn**
