¶ *Stand for the* **Presentation of the Candidate**

*The candidate for baptism, together with his parents and godparents,
come to the front.*

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them.' We thank God for Otto who has come to be baptised today. Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church. So I ask you all:

Will you support Otto as he begins his journey of faith?

We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family?

We will.

¶ *Remain standing for the* **Decision**

The priest addresses the candidate through the parents and godparents:

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? **I do.**

Do you reject evil? **I do.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **I do.**

Do you trust in him as Lord? **I do.**

¶ **Signing with the Cross**

*The priest makes the sign of the cross on the candidate's forehead,
using oil blessed by the bishop, and invites the parents and godparents
to do the same, saying:*

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.
Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

**Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

¶ Remain standing for the Prayer over the Water

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptised in the River Jordan, here your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptised in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.**

¶ Remain standing for the Declaration of Faith

Let us declare our faith in God.

**We believe in God the Father,
from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.**

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high.

We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

¶ *Remain standing for the* **Baptism**

The priest asks the parents and godparents:

Do you ask for this child be baptised into the faith of Christ and his Church?

I do.

The priest pours water on the candidate, saying

Otto, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

The God of power and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin and brought you to new life through water and the Holy Spirit. He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation, [*Oil of Chrism is poured on the head of the candidate*] so that, united with his people, you may remain for ever a member of Christ, who is Priest, Prophet and King.

¶ *Remain standing for the* **Welcome**

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism:
by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

¶ *Remain standing for the* **Prayers of Penitence**

God our Father, long-suffering, full of grace and truth, you create us from nothing and give us life. You give your faithful people new life in the water of baptism. You do not turn your face from us, nor cast us aside. We confess that we have sinned against you and our neighbour. We have wounded your love and marred your image in us. Restore us for the sake of your Son, and bring us to heavenly joy, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, † pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

¶ *Remain standing for the* **Procession from the Font**

The people are sprinkled with water from the font to signify the cleansing nature of Christ for us.

Water of life, cleanse and refresh us;

Raise us to life in Christ Jesus.

Dying with Christ, so we shall rise with him

Death shall no longer have pow'r over us.

¶ *Kneel or sit for the* **Prayers of Intercession**

The priest introduces the intercessions:

We share, with all the members of the Church, the privilege of praying to our Father, through his Son Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

As a royal priesthood, let us pray to the Father through Christ who ever lives to intercede for us.

The intercessor continues:

Reveal your kingdom among the nations; as we pray for our brothers and sisters throughout the world, may peace abound and justice flourish.

Your name be hallowed.

Your kingdom come.

Send down upon us the gift of your Holy Spirit and renew your Church with power from on high.

Your name be hallowed.

Your kingdom come.

Deliver the oppressed, strengthen the weak, heal and restore your creation.

Your name be hallowed.

Your kingdom come.

Rejoicing in the fellowship of the Church on earth, we join our prayers with all the saints in glory.

Your name be hallowed.

The priest introduces a period of silent prayer and then concludes:

God of mercy, by whose grace alone we are accepted and equipped for your service: stir up in us the gifts of your Holy Spirit and make us worthy of our calling; that we may bring forth the fruit of the Spirit in love and joy and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour. His dying and rising have set us free from sin and death.

And so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and singing:



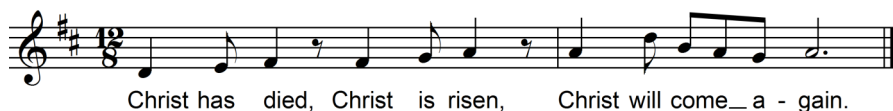
We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did. In him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:



Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Apostles, the Martyrs and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Distribution of the Sacrament

*Anyone who has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
and wishes to receive the love of the Lord Jesus in their life,
is welcome to receive communion at this service.*

*If you are worried about receiving the Chalice, please remember
that making your Communion in one kind is entirely valid.*

We ask you not to dip the wafer into the chalice.

*Alternatively you may wish to come for a blessing: please keep your hands
down and your head bowed to indicate that this is your preference.*
