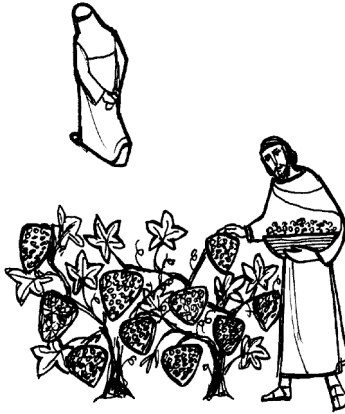

¶ Stand for the **Nicene Creed**

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

It is customary to bow for the next paragraph

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

**We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come.
Amen.**

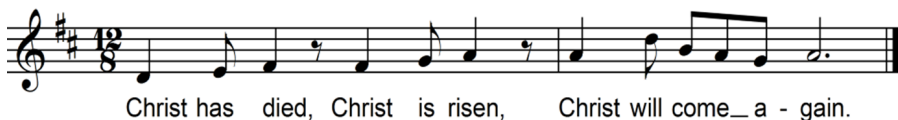

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Harvest Thanksgiving

Our service of Harvest Thanksgiving is next Sunday, 27 September, and we will once again be collecting donations to benefit the foodbank.

Donations of everyday items for breakfast, lunch and dinner are welcome but especially the following items which we are currently short of:

- Cup-a-soup
- Fruit juice
- Instant mash potato (packets)
- Instant pasta pots and pot noodles
- Tinned fruit, meat and vegetables
- Tinned rice pudding and custard

Please no baked beans, dried pasta, tinned sweetcorn, chickpeas or fish as we already have plenty of these!

Donations of sturdy carrier bags are also welcomed, particularly when bringing gifts forward during next week's service. These are then reused when preparing our parcels for delivery to clients.

This year, to the end of August, the foodbank has already helped 663 people across 329 food packages, giving out a total of 8.496 kg of food. In return, we have collected 7,817 kg of donations.

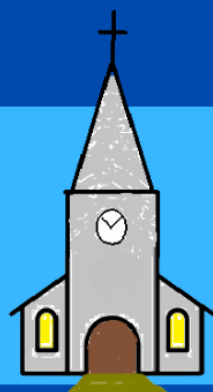
The foodbank also receives around £2,000 in donations each month however with running costs averaging around £4,500 per month we need to increase financial donations alongside donations in the shops.
