O blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways. By the labour of your hands you shall eat; you will be happy and prosper. (Response))

The wife like a fruitful vine in the heart of your house; your children like shoots of the olive around your table. (Response)

Indeed thus shall be blessed the man who fears the Lord. May the Lord bless you from Zion all the days of your life! May you see your children's children in a happy Jerusalem! On Israel, peace! (Response)

# ¶ Stand for the Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

Please bow for the next three lines:

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

¶ Kneel or sit for the **Prayers of Intercession** 

The Priest introduces the prayers.

To the bidding Lord, in your mercy Please respond by saying **Hear our prayer.** 

After the prayer for the faithful departed the intercessor says:
Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord
And let light perpetual shine upon them.
May they rest in peace
and rise in glory.

The priest announces a period of silence and says a concluding prayer.

A collection is taken for the mission and upkeep of the Church. The Altar is prepared and gifts of bread and wine are placed on it.



# May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name for our good and the good of all his holy church.



Living God, Father of light, hope of nations, friend of sinners, builder of the city that is to come: your love is made visible in Jesus Christ, you bring home the lost, restore the sinner and give dignity to the despised.

In the face of Jesus Christ your light shines out, flooding lives with goodness and truth, gathering into one a divided and broken humanity.

With people from every race and nation, with the Church of all the ages, with apostles, evangelists and martyrs, we join the angels of heaven in their unending song:



We praise and bless you, loving father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

# ¶ Remain standing for the Lord's Prayer and Peace

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.


Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

#### Distribution of the Sacrament

**The Eucharist and Intinction** Intinction is the practice of dipping the bread wafers into the wine. This has implications for those who are gluten intolerant as traces of gluten are more likely to enter the wine. We therefore ask you **not to dip the wafer into the chalice**.

Anyone who has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and wishes to receive the love of the Lord Jesus in their life, is welcome to receive communion at this service. The Chalice will be offered for those who wish to receive in both kinds. There is no compulsion about this. If you are worried about receiving the Chalice, please remember that making your Communion in one kind is entirely acceptable. Alternatively you may wish to come for a blessing: please keep your hands down and your head bowed to indicate that this is your preference.
