# ¶ The Liturgy of the Word

¶ Sit for the First Reading (Revelation 12:7–12)

At the end the reader says: This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

¶ Remain seated for the **Responsorial Psalm** (Ps. 138)

and join in singing the response Response and Chant: MHE



In the pre-sence of the an-gels I will bless\_\_ you, O Lord.

I thank you, Lord, with all my heart: you have heard the words of my mouth. In the presence of the angels I will bless you. I will adore before your holy temple. (*Response*)

I thank you for your faithfulness and love, which excel all we ever knew of you. On the day I called, you answered; you increased the strength of my soul. (*Response*)

All earth's kings shall thank you when they hear the words of your mouth. They shall sing of the Lord's ways: 'How great is the glory of the Lord!' (Response)

¶ Remain seated for the Second Reading (Hebrews 1:5–14)

At the end the reader says: This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

¶ Stand for the Gospel Acclamation

and turn towards the Gospel reader



Cantor:	Give thanks to the Lord, all his hosts,
	his servants who do his will.
All:	Alleluia (as above)

¶ Remain standing for the **Gospel** (John 1: 47–51)

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the Gospel the reader says: This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

¶ Stand for the Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

#### Please bow for the next three lines:

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

# ¶ Kneel or sit for the Prayers of Intercession

The priest introduces the intercessions.

To the bidding Lord, in your mercy Please respond by saying **Hear our prayer.** 

After the prayer for the faithful departed: Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord. **and let light perpetual shine upon them.** May they rest in peace **and rise in glory.** 

After a period of silent reflection the priest says a closing prayer.

# ¶ The Liturgy of the Sacrament

Hear again the song of the angels: 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace.'

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

#### ¶ Remain standing for the Offertory Hymn

Christ, the fair glory of the holy angels, Thou who hast made us, thou who o'er us rulest, Grant of thy mercy unto us thy servants Steps up to heaven.

Send thy archangel, Michael, to our succour; Peacemaker blessèd, may he banish from us Striving and hatred, so that for the peaceful All things may prosper.

Send thy archangel, Gabriel, the mighty; Herald of heaven, may he from us mortals Spurn the old serpent, watching o'er the temples Where thou art worshiped.

Send thy archangel, Raphael, the restorer Of the misguided ways of men who wander, Who at thy bidding strengthens soul and body With thine anointing.

May the blest Mother of our God and Saviour, May the assembly of the saints in glory, May the celestial companies of angels Ever assist us. Father almighty, Son and Holy Spirit, God ever blessèd, be thou our preserver; Thine is the glory which the angels worship, Veiling their faces. Amen.




# ¶ Remain standing for the **Prayer over the Gifts**

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

# May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

We offer you a sacrifice of praise, O Lord, humbly entreating that, as these gifts are borne by the ministry of Angels into the presence of your majesty, so you may receive them favourably and make them profitable for our salvation; through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.





It is indeed right and good, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. You reveal your wise purpose for the salvation of the human race by assigning to the angels and archangels the ministry of your steadfast love and protection. While they contemplate your glory, standing before you and singing your praise, they keep a faithful vigil for us, guarding us along the way that leads to life, and guiding us towards the kingdom of your light. In joyful gladness we unite our voices with theirs and sing the ageless hymn of your praise:



We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you,

gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:



Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Apostles, the Martyrs and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.



¶ Remain standing for the Lord's Prayer

Jesus taught us to call God our Father, and so we pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

# ¶ Remain standing for the Breaking of the Bread


We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

# Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.





# **Distribution of the Sacrament**

Anyone who has been baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and wishes to receive the love of the Lord Jesus in their life, is welcome to receive Communion at this service.

<u>Intinction</u> is the practice of dipping the bread wafers into the wine. This has implications for those who are gluten intolerant because traces of gluten are more likely to enter the wine. We therefore ask you **not to dip the wafer into the chalice**. Please remember that making your Communion in one kind is entirely acceptable.

If you do not wish to receive, you, as well as any children with you, are invited to come up with everyone else for a blessing. Please indicate that you would like a blessing by bowing your head and keeping your hands down.

¶ Remain kneeling or seated for the **Communion Hymn** Bright the vision that delighted Once the sight of Judah's seer; Sweet the countless tongues united To entrance the prophet's ear. Round the Lord in glory seated Cherubim and seraphim Filled his temple, and repeated Each to each the alternate hymn: 'Lord, thy glory fills the heaven; Earth is with its fullness stored: Unto thee be glory given, Holy, Holy, Holy Lord.' Heaven is still with glory ringing, Earth takes up the angels' cry, 'Holy, Holy, Holy,' singing, 'Lord of hosts, the Lord most high.'
